Gospel Reading
Luke 1:39-56

Mary greets Elizabeth and sings God's praise.

In today's Gospel, Elizabeth and Mary recognize the work that God is doing through them. With eyes of faith they see the power and salvation of God breaking through into their lives and into the world.

Gather as a family and talk about what you know about Mary and her being a model of faith. Recall that we are celebrating a holy day, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. On this day we remember that God took Mary to heaven, body and soul. Read together today's Gospel, Luke 1:39-56. In this reading we hear Mary's song of praise to God, the Magnificat. Invite each person in the family to write or draw one or more ways in which they see God working in your family life and in our world today. Use these prayers of thanksgiving to create your family's song of praise to God. Conclude by praying together this song of praise.

St Joseph’s can use volunteers to sing up for refreshments to be serves after Sunday Mass. There is a sign up sheet posted in the bulleting board in the social hall.

Have you been wondering if you are being called to active ministry in our church?

There is training for every ministry and you will have opportunities to practice. It’s normal to be nervous, it’s something new, important and beautiful. Take a chance.

Sacristan arrives early to prepare the altar for Mass. This ministry involves setting the books for the Mass, preparing the Chalice, and making sure all items needed for Mass are in place. After mass, the same items are put away properly.

Extraordinary Minister (EM) this ministry is commissioned to assist the priest in distributing communion

Lector this includes reading the payer before Mass, first and second reading and prayers of the faithful.

Usher this ministry involves coming in early to greet people as they enter the church, taking care of the collection and helping people find seating as needed during large masses.

Alter Server assists the priests in procession and during Mass, Must be 7 yrs old or older and have made your first communion. Yes, Adults you are welcome too.

Homebound Minister This ministry takes communion to the sick and homebound. Generally, it could be just 1 or 2 persons that you would take communion to. There is a guided script to help and training . Having people who live in different part of the parish is helpful.

Religious Education This ministry teaches or supports teachers in religious education of parish children to grow in faith, understanding, and love preparing them to receive the sacraments and to build a future with Christ at the center of their heart.

Youth Ministry There currently isn’t an active ministry, but if you have this call maybe something in th future is possible.

Today's Reflection Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A) Sunday August 16, 2026

I Do Believe

Sunday’s Gospel can give a headache to preachers and to any Christian. Jesus refuses to heal a woman because she is, in his metaphor, one of the “dogs.”

You know the story. A Canaanite woman cries out for help and Jesus at first will not even talk to her! Then the disciples demand that Jesus send her away because she is a trouble-maker. He seems to agree with them. “I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel,” he says.

Finally the poor woman walks right up, does “homage” to Jesus and says, “Lord, help me.”

Jesus would never ignore such words, at least so we Christians and Catholics believe. Nor should we ever be deaf to them in our own daily lives.

Yet he says to her, “It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs.”

Ouch. This is the line that is so hard for us to explain. So un-Jesus-like, it seems.

But there are clues. She first called out to him with the words “Son of David.” This is a term hallowed by use in the ancient Hebrew scriptures, always referring to the Messiah. She is a Canaanite, and they had no Messiah, especially not from David. This woman seems to have belief in Jesus.

And she calls him “Lord.” In Matthew’s gospel this is an explicit admission that Jesus and God are one. Going just on her language, she must have believed in him as the Savior.

Surely he sensed this.

But Israel and the Canaanites had long been in strife. How could “they” with their strange gods produce a woman who believes in the one God and in Jesus?

Is it possible that Jesus was drawing her out, teasing her in order to strengthen her belief?

Perhaps he was quoting the word “dogs” as a reference to names the two peoples called each other. “My people of Israel believe in the one God and your people do not. How can I give their food to you ‘dogs’?”

The woman’s quick wit provides a wonderful, humble, bantering response that wins the day: “Even dogs eat scraps that fall from their master’s table.” It is a riposte, a parry, a counter-thrust, and Jesus loves it. She is really saying, “It does not matter what a person’s status is as long as they believe. And I do believe.”

I’ll bet Jesus smiled a great smile as he told her how great her faith was. Maybe he laughed at her fast repartee. And of course he gladly gave her what she asked; he cured her daughter.

Doesn’t Christ’s Holy Spirit smile within you and me when we ask for what we need? When we let nothing stand in the way, like our own origins, our status in life, our sins, and maybe even our rejection by others?

We approach Communion and hold out our hands and say in effect, “Son of David, have pity on me.” Our response is “Amen.” This is a paraphrase of the Canaanite woman, because it means “I do believe.” Let us mean it this Sunday.
